

New Regulator/New Commissioner Training

This year in conjunction with the NAGRA Annual Education and Training Conference, we are pleased to offer a pre-conference training for “new” regulators presented by a robust panel of speakers hosted and organized by the International Masters of Gaming Law.

The agenda will include:

09:15 Introduction to being a Commissioner/Regulator

The panel will generally discuss the principal reasons of why gaming is regulated:

- Contain inherent ills associated with the activity
- To raise funds for public/altruistic purposes and extract maximum economic benefits
- Ensure game integrity

10:15 How do the different forms of gaming operate

The panel will facilitate a broad discussion of the differences between the various gaming activities and their regulation such as Casino, Distributed, iGaming/Mobile, Lottery, Sports betting, Pari-mutuel, Tribal, Charitable, Skill-based, Ship-based.

11:30 Cross-Border effects of gaming regulation

The panel will discuss the synergies and tensions outside of a jurisdiction from gaming regulation. Topics will include federal laws implicating interstate gambling, approaches to multi-jurisdictional licensing, investigations and information sharing, and cross border “revenue poaching.” Topics will also include differences in structure from other jurisdictions, federal law vs. state law vs. tribal law, open meetings/records.

12:30 Lunch - Lunch will be a working lunch with continued discussion of the morning topics and stimulated via a moderator.

13:30 How to regulate gaming in the United States

Law enforcement and prosecutorial disparities and approaches; illegal activity, grey/black market. Allocation of resources.

14:30 Emerging issues in gaming in the United States

This session will be a potpourri of topics of interest to the audience to include subjects such as Sports betting, payments, KYC/AML, cashless technologies, alternative currencies and consideration, foreign investor oversight, etc.
